

Certification and Benefit Issuance

Certification and benefit issuance refers to the process used to determine a student's eligibility for free or reduced-price (F/RP) meal benefits and the method used to apply the correct meal benefit level for the student at the point of service.

Certification documents include either eligibility application for F/RP meals, direct certification, or other categorical eligibility determinations. Benefit issuance documents, includes rosters or master lists, and any other medium that is used by the school to identify the eligibility categories of students at the point of service.

When a local educational agency (LEA) enters into an agreement with the California Department of Education (CDE) to operate the National School Lunch and School Breakfast Programs, the LEA must establish a F/RP Meal Policy Statement. As part of the school nutrition program sponsor application process, the Nutrition Services Division (NSD) provides the LEA with a policy statement template.

LEAs must check to ensure that students are eligible to receive F/RP meals. As part of the F/RP Policy Statement, LEAs must designate a Determining Official who is responsible for reviewing the applications for completeness and determining whether the household is eligible for F/RP meals. If they are not eligible, students must pay an amount established by the district or agency for meals.
